

National Park Rules



PLEASE NOTE, THESE RULES ARE TO ENSURE YOUR SAFETY AND THE PROTECTION OF WILDLIFE, AS ISSUED BY THE INDONESIAN GOVERNMENT AND TNGL.

RULE 1

- The maximum number of visitors per group is 7.
- This controls the risk of human impact AND optimises your viewing experience.

RULE 2:

- Visitors who are sick should not go trekking.
- Report any sickness to any SEE Team member and we will reschedule your trek.
- we can and will refuse a trek to anyone who is visibly sick.

RULE 3:

- Healthy visitors should NOT be closer than 10m from any wildlife.

RULE 4:

- Behave 'properly' when you are close to wildlife, therefore:
- Do not call the orangutans.
- Do not feed/give drinks to orangutans.
- Do not smoke, eat, drink or spit.
- Stay close and listen to your guide.
- Be silent and sit when watching wildlife.
- Use good body language- no sudden, loud moves.

RULE 5:

- Do not approach orangutans, and NEVER come between a mother and her baby.
- If an orangutan comes close to you and you cannot move away, keep calm, try to sit down and do not make eye contact.

RULE 6:

- Giving food to orangutans and getting too close for exploitation purposes (photos/touching) can impact their health and is therefore illegal.
- Anyone who violates this law (UU Tahun 1990, Article 21 paragraph 2a) may face up to 5 years in prison and be fined 100,000,000 IDR.
